Number **AEROPHILATELY**

1 Czechoslovakia 1930 Airmail Issue.

Ross A L Wood (WA)

The first set of airmail stamps from Czechoslovakia designed especially for this purpose.

2 Inaugural Postal Service Flight - Cocos (Keeling) Islands to Australia 23 November 1955.

Kim B Dwyer (NSW)

Describes and illustrates the many and varied postal rates which applied for this one, single flight, on just one day. Examples of overpaid and underpaid cover are shown as are covers bearing the scarce red and black cachets.

ASTROPHILATELY

3 Apollo 13 A Successful Failure.

Ross Newton (VIC)

Apollo 13 was to be the third manned space flight to the moon, however an explosion on the spacecraft aborted the lunar landing. This exhibit covers all stages of the mission, which was considered a successful failure because of the experience gained in rescuing the astronauts.

CINDERELLAS

4 Province of Bumbunga.

Martin James Walker (SA)

A study of the 'stamps' issued by the self-proclaimed Province of Bumbunga in South Australia from 1980-1986.

FIRST DAY COVERS

5 New Zealand Health Covers 1935-1948.

Linda Welden (SA)

An exhibit of NZ FDC's starting with the first official postal authority cover as well as private producers, and covers the 1st 13 years of use.

OPEN

6 Marjan Rowinski - His War Years.

Bruce Chadderton (NSW)

Rowinski was a Polish soldier who spent much of WWII corresponding with his wife from the Mauthausen Concentration Camp.

7 **Remembering Edith Cavell.**

Marilyn Gendek (ACT)

This year marks the centenary of the death of Nurse Edith Cavell. This open Philatelic exhibit tells her story from a range of philatelic and non-philatelic items that were published in remembering Edith Cavell and after WWI.

8 **Sydney Harbour Bridge.**

Lynn M Kitchin (NSW)

The first plans for the Harbour Bridge were by Greenway in the Macquarie era, work began in 1923 and took eight long years to complete & affectionately become known as "The Coathanger".

9 **The Scottish Women's Hospital Royaumont 1914-18.**

Marilyn Gendek (ACT)

A study of a French hospital established by Scottish women near the Western Front in WWI. The hospital at Royaumont Abbey was equipped, administered, and staffed by women volunteers including surgeons, nurses, orderlies and ambulance drivers.

10 **Wembley Exhibition and Malaya.**

Jeffrey Newman (NSW)

The 1924-1925 British Empire Exhibition included 'THE MALAYA PAVILION' & special cancellations were used in Malay to publicise the event. Examples of these are shown as well as postcards relating to the Pavilion or to Malaya.

11 **Diamonds.**

Kim D Dwyer (NSW)

A brief insight into the geological origins of diamonds and the methods used to extract them from the earth. The methods and designs used in cutting are also shown, as well as various uses in jewellery & adornment and celebration of anniversaries.

12 **The ANZAC Tradition.**

Donald Catterall (NSW)

This display celebrates our proud ANZAC tradition by the means of stamps, covers, lettercards, postcards and cinderellas.

POSTAL HISTORY

13 **The First AIF – November 1914 – April 1915.**

John Higgs (NSW)

Included in this exhibit are cards and covers sent from soldiers on the First Convoy. Also included is a selection of mail sent after arrival of the first AIF in Egypt in December 1914, until their departure for Gallipoli in April 1915.

- 14 **Australia Parcel Post Label P.P.1.**
Roger Eggleton (NSW)
 A chronological study of P.P.1, the humble Commonwealth of Australia Parcels Post Label, with particular attention to its many printings.
- 15 **Australian Postmark Propaganda of World War Two.**
Martin James Walker (SA)
 Exhibit showing the use of postmarks and franking machine slogans promoting Australia's defence, security and morale during World War Two.
- 16 **New South Wales Stampless Mail 1850-1852.**
Stephen Browne (NSW)
 This exhibit traces the development of postal rates in the colony of New South Wales from the introduction of the 1849 Postal Act to the 1851 Postal Act prescribed that all mail had to be prepaid with postage stamps from 1 May 1852. These rates are illustrated by stampless mail.
- 17 **N.S.W. Date Stamps – Years of Change – The 1850's.**
Barbara Hancock (NSW)
 Problems with the oval and large circular date-stamps led to trials in 1856 to produce a more satisfactory type, resulting in the small circular date-stamps issued to all offices in 1857.
- 18 **Numeral Cancellations & Postmarks on N.S.W. Stamps 1880's – 1900's.**
Russell John Goddard (NSW)
 Envelopes from Sydney and isolated towns established during Australia's gold rush period with Numeral No's & cancellations. Towns include Burruga, Reid's Flat, Tuena, Jerrong etc.
- 19 **Re-Closing Label.**
Anthony Scott (NSW)
 Re-closing labels were part of the Postal Censorship imposed throughout Australia from 3rd September 1939 on both inward and outward mails of all sorts and was terminated on the 10th November 1945.
- 20 **Tasmania Free Mail 1853 to 1882: Acts and Regs.**
Peter Allan (TAS)
 Illustrates the key provisions of the "Signature Frank" system, 1853-82
- 21 **The Boer War 1899-1902 – Burgher/Concentration/Refugee Camps.**
John Pugsley (NSW)
 Lord Kitchener's "Scorched Earth Policy" starting in 1900, resulted in thousands of Boer civilians becoming homeless. Special camps to hold these and other refugees were setup. Mail to/from many of these camps are illustrated.

POSTAL HISTORY 3C

- 22 **Ladysmith 1899-1900.**
John Pugsley (NSW)
 This display deals with the early period of the Anglo-Boer War of 1899 to 1902, specifically the conflict in Northern Natal, with the emphasis on the siege and relief of the British Garrison township of Ladysmith.
- 23 **Prisoner of War – Borneo Camps – Liberation and Repatriation.**
Anthony L Walker (NSW)
 Initially highlights the liberation of the POW camp at Batu Lintang, Kuching by Australian troops. Then deals with the treatment and repatriation of the surviving POW through the mails and communications involved with this process.
- 24 **Prisoner of War - Borneo Camps - 1942 to 1945**
Anthony L Walker (NSW)
 An initial look at mail from the Punjab 2/15 is followed by the process of searching for, locating of POW. Thence the mails to and from the POW's, culminating with the communications involving those unfortunate enough to be at Sandakan.
- 25 **General Douglas MacArthur Defender and Liberator of the Philippines.**
David Figg (SA)
 Mention the phrase "I shall return" and most people think of General Douglas MacArthur. This exhibit concentrates on the years 1937 to 1945 when, apart from his escape to Australia in March 1942 until his return in October 1945, the General spent time in the Philippines.
- 26 **Australian's at the Boer War.**
John Pugsley (NSW)
 This exhibit shows mail about, to, and from Australians serving with the British Army and Australian Colonial contingents in South Africa during the Boer War 1899-1902.
- 27 **Aubrey Gotley and the Establishment of Heard Island Base 1947-1949.**
Kevin W Dwyer (NSW)
 Aubrey Gotley was the leader of the first expedition to establish on Heard Island, Australia's First Antarctic Base. His dedication and leadership in the 400 days (11 Dec 1947 'til 11 February 1949) it took to make this a workable base was a remarkable achievement.
- 28 **Ships chartered by ANARE 1947-1990.**
Kevin W Dwyer (NSW)
 The only way Australia can re-supply her A.A.T. Bases is by ship in the summer months. From 1947 'til 1990 A.N.A.R.E. used and chartered 3 HMA and 10 foreign ships at an annual cost of around \$14m. In 1990 Australia built its own ice breaker RSV Aurora Australis.

29 **Soviet Arctic High Latitude Expeditions – Drift Stations North Pole 4 & 5, 1955-1957.**

Anthony L Walker (NSW)

Through the mail, radio telegrams, real photos and QSL cards this display provides an insight into the life of personnel who took part in the North Pole Drift Stations 4 & 5.

PICTURE POSTCARDS

30 **A Child's Plea – "Please have you got a Cigarette Card?"**

David Figg (SA)

Children have collected many things over the years, but one item they quickly learnt to cadge from smokers was the ubiquitous cigarette card. This exhibit shows comical postcards of gentlemen caught in unusual predicaments with little boys eager to seize upon the moment and hopefully add to their collection.

31 **Maximilian Joseph I, First King of Bavaria 1806-1825.**

Marguerite M Andrews (QLD)

King Maximilian Joseph I was a 19th century product of the age of enlightenment. His monarchy at first made possible through the influence and support of Napoleon established the foundations to advance Bavaria as a culture centre of the world & many of his legacies exist today.

32 **Appliqued Materials.**

Pauline Edwards (SA)

This display shows the variety of materials attached to postcards in various ways. These range from different papers, natural or man-made materials to metallic objects.

33 **Benedictine – The Story of a Liqueur.**

Jennifer Roland (SA)

This exhibit shows the story behind the liqueur; the rebuilt abbey, the factory, the pharmacy, the museum and wartime hospital. Poster cards are included.

34 **Bligh, Bounty and Pitcairn.**

John Edward Crowsley (QLD)

Bligh's voyage on the 'Bounty' to collect breadfruit, ended in a Mutiny. The mutineers sailed east and established a community on Pitcairn Island. Developed over ensuring years the inhabitants rely on the sea for transport and trade.

35 **Brookes Limited.**

David Figg (SA)

This exhibit shows the range of advertising postcards produced by Brookes Limited. They were in the stoneworks business with quarries in England, Wales, Scandinavia and Channel Islands. Around 500 local authorities and railways used their nonslip stone and in 1930 were the world's largest supplier of road and building materials.

36 Children's Pastimes.

Pauline Edwards (SA)

There are many games and activities which our parents played as youngsters. Shown here are some of these which were enjoyed indoors and out.

37 Coogee.

Lynn M Kitchin (NSW)

Coogee Beach within the Municipality of Randwick and five miles from the GPO Sydney - is a great place to Sun & Surf while enjoying your holiday break away - you can enjoy the Races & Sports at Coogee Oval.

38 Halls Gap - a place to stay.

David Edwards (SA)

Halls Gap situated in the Grampians National Park (Garwerd) in Victoria and is situated between two mountain ranges and is not part of the National Park. Due to the large number of visitors each year a large number of guest houses and a large caravan park were built.

39 Jenolan Caves - Developing a Tourist Destination 1800's – 1927.

Vivienne Scott (NSW)

This exhibit is a pictorial presentation of the early development and promotion of Jenolan Caves as a tourist destination. The exhibit also highlights the early development of photography and production of souvenir postcards.

40 Great Cricketers of the Early Years.

Donald Catterall (NSW)

This display features early postcards of nine Australian and six English Cricketers from the first fifty years of Test Cricket along with details of their careers.

41 My Pandora's Box.

Linda Welden (SA)

An exhibit featuring postcards of the early 1900's based on my family with most cards being produced by Kodak Australia.

42 Newcastle - Early Postcards of Harbour, Railway and Tram.

Donald Catterall (NSW)

With the sale of our Harbour, the removal of the Rail and the advent of Light Rail, this display of early local postcards serves as a reminder of what once was.

43 Sunlight Soap.

Linda Welden (SA)

A modern exhibit of reproduction postcards of one of our popularly known detergents 'Sunlight Soap'. This humorous look at how publicity introduce products.

44 **The Adelaide Hills Railway Viaduct.**

David Figg (SA)

The Adelaide Hills Railway Viaduct (1883-1919) crossed two steep gullies and was criticized during its construction. Even after being tested with a train weighing nearly 200 tones, it was thought to be too frail for high speeds but stood the test of time operating successfully for over 36 years.

45 **The Dream King - Ludwig II of Bavaria 1845-1886.**

Marguerite M Andrews (QLD)

The life and dreams of King Ludwig II of Bavaria, his castles including Neuschwanstein, made famous by Walt Disney at Disneyland. His and his personal physician's suspicious and unexplained death by drowning.

46 **The Macquarie era & The Collector's Chest.**

Lynn M Kitchin (NSW)

In 1817 Macquarie and his family toured the Hunter Valley Region and new buildings with Commandant Wallis, he completed a chest with specimens collected by the local Aboriginals and painted by convict artist Joseph Lycett.

47 **What's the Time?**

Anthony Presgrave (SA)

A study of Turret Clocks in South Australia using picture postcards. There are 23 of these clocks mainly in Town Halls and Churches.

POSTAL STATIONERY

48 **A.W.Sandford printed to private order envelopes - 1930 to 1956.**

Bernard Beston (QLD)

PTO envelopes of A.W.Sandford & Co. LTD, Adelaide, Australia. From King George V to Queen Elizabeth II.

49 **Australia QEII Lettersheets.**

Bernard Beston (QLD)

An exhibit of the 5d, 4c and 5c QEII Lettersheets of Australia.

50 **Cape of Good Hope Queen Victoria Prestamped Envelopes.**

Philip Levine (QLD)

The complete range of prestamped Queen Victoria envelopes of this important and strategic British African Colony is shown. Highlights are unusual usage and precursor material.

51 **Postal Stationery from Germany's Pneumatic Mail.**

Klaus Barrasch (NSW)

This exhibit demonstrates a fine selection of pneumatic postcards and letters.
(Rohrpostkarten and Rohrpostbriefe)

POSTAL STATIONERY- AEROGRAMMES

52 **Aerogrammes of Afghanistan.**

John Dibiase (WA)

Aerogrammes issued by the Government of Afghanistan including Formular, Usage and Varieties.

53 **Airletters and Aerogrammes of Burma.**

Martin James Walker (SA)

A study of the issues of Burma from 1946 until the name of the country was changed to Myanmar.

54 **Australia 10c 3 flap definitive Aerogramme.**

Joan Orr (QLD)

A study of the two forms showing essays, varieties of paper and gum, also changed wording on front and back panels. Usage including the large "C" in 10c.

55 **Australia 33c Aerogramme - 1981 Issues.**

Joan Orr (QLD)

Three issues were produced during 1981 following a trial sample and questionnaire result sent to customers who purchased large quantities of Aerogrammes for use in their businesses. Their story continues until a price rise May 1982 signalled their end.

56 **Australia/Airmail Letter Cards.**

Joan Orr (QLD)

Card types for use in the Middle East, Malaya, Australia and Papua New Guinea during 1941-1945 showing formats, printings, shades and varieties.

57 **George VI Aerogrammes of Canada.**

Ian J McMahon (ACT)

This display covers the first issues of Canadian Aerogrammes depicting King George VI.

58 **Gold Coast Prestamped Airletters.**

Philip Levine (QLD)

A full showing of the prestamped Airletters of this important British African Colony. Unusual usage is shown, along with specimens and essay.

59 **Norway Aerograms 1948-1988.**

John Edward Crowsley (QLD)

Norway only produced Aerograms between 1948 and 1988. Three basic 'Flying Bird' indicia and one generic were used. The 31 recognised issues are shown. Differences in design, phosphor variations and printing numbers are included.

60 **Papua & New Guinea pre Decimal Airletters & Aerogrammes.**

Joan Orr (QLD)

Airletters, Australian issues used and for use in P&NG plus Aerogrammes from 1953 for use in the Territory including papers, UV reactions, Gums, changed wording, varieties and usage.

61 **Singapore Aerogrammes - King George VI & Queen Elizabeth II issues.**

Glen Stafford (WA)

This exhibit shows the introduction of Aerogrammes in Singapore with the KGVI and QEII issues.

62 **The Specimen issues of the Pre-decimal Australian Airletters and Aerogrammes.**

Ed Wolf (NSW)

Specimen aerogrammes are much scarcer than most philatelists realise. This exhibit sets the record straight.

REVENUES

63 **Queensland Stamp Duty - The first design 1866-1868.**

Craig Chappell (QLD)

1866 no watermark - all denominations, including unissued denominations, plate proofs, thin paper, printings, imperforate one side and usage. 1868 watermarked - all denominations, including plate proof, printings and usage.

THEMATIC PHILATELY

64 **I am Nothing.**

Michael Rhodes (WA)

I have been a difficult concept for man to comprehend. I was however needed as a way to account for the absence of anything to make use of man's ideas but I am still nothing.

65 **The Trolley Bus.**

Ian Laney (NSW)

This is the story of the Trolley Bus [also known as a trackless Tram (in early years), a trolley coach, a trackless trolley, or just a trolley]. It details their invention and evolution plus shows that they form part of the fabric of today's mass transit.

66 **Wild Geese.**

Joan Orr (QLD)

Since the earliest history Wild Geese have attracted man's attention by their beauty of form and movements, their impressive migrations and wildness of their calls. This is their story.

TRADITIONAL67 **'Green Emu' - The Australian Frama Reprint Paper**

Michel Roland (SA)

This exhibit studies a short period in 1994 relatively obscure to most collectors of Australian philately.

68 **\$10 Painting Stamp.**

Gregory Laidler (NSW)

The \$10 Painting definitive stamp of 1977 was the highest value Australian stamp when issued. This unpublished study shows the 2 different printing layouts, 3 paper types, marginal markings and some of the many constant varieties.

69 **1977 Christmas Stamp.**

Gregory Laidler (NSW)

The 1977 Christmas issue set of 2 stamps was the first Christmas issue with one stamp of a nonreligious theme. This is a study of the stamps, including printing and gum varieties, plate varieties and usage of letters and packets.

70 **A Study of the KGV 1d Die 3 Issue.**

Gordon Monk (SA)

This exhibit shows 25 of the possible 27 varieties of the issue, some of the varieties have more than 1 state. When the plate was made, more moulds were made than were required for the printing plate and the extra moulds were used to make postal stationery items. The exhibit shows stamps, private and official perfins, including the RARE T, and stationery items.

71 **British Forces in Egypt.**

John Pugsley (NSW)

From 1932 to 1941 special rates of postage were permitted British Forces in Egypt, for which 15 individual stamps were issued in that period. Examples of all 15, mint, and used on cover are shown here.

72 **Egypt - Early Issues.**

John Pugsley (NSW)

This exhibit features the earliest Egyptian postage stamps, which were issued between 1886 and 1914, the period of declining Ottoman Empire domination. A small amount of stamp usage on cover is included on mail from 1880 onwards.

73 Errors on the first issue, 1852 from the Netherlands.

Alex Nuijten (SA)

This exhibit represents the specialised study of errors in the first issue. Although quality control was very secure, it made an error once in a while.

74 Jordan Occupation of Palestine Overprints.

Bernard Beston (QLD)

The 1948 Jordan occupation of Palestine overprint issues included inverted and double varieties and extensive use on cover.

75 KGV 1d Printers Markings, Monograms and Imprints of Plate 4 Panes 7 and 8.

Gordon Monk (SA)

This exhibit shows in chronological order of issues, printers and variety reworks, the monograms and imprints from the lower right plate. This plate has the most complicated series of printers markings of the four plates, and includes Cooke no monogram printing, a possible unique imprint with NY joined, instead of 8-55, and an Ash block without imprint.

76 King George V Silver Jubilee Strait Settlements Issue.

John Franklin (NSW)

On 6th May 1935 the Colony of Strait Settlements released four common design issues to meet the needs of postage rates. Here we see how postal services applied to domestic and overseas.

77 Mr. Allcott's Painting - Australia's Sesquicentenary Stamps, their production and usage.

Richard Peck (NSW)

Based on personal archival research.

78 Postage Due Stamps of Victoria - 1890-1894, the Blue and Red Bi-colours.

John Waugh (VIC)

This exhibit includes mint and used examples of all denominations, rare blocks of the 1/2d, a variety of scarcer cancellations and covers illustrating instructional markings, usages and processes.

79 Queensland Railways Parcel Stamp 1919-1927.

Donald Catterall (NSW)

This display features the 1919 series of Perforated and Rouletted issues. Station Numbers and Names are shown with unlisted examples as well as varieties such as double Station Names and Security Underprinted items. CDS and Numeral Cancels are included as well as Thin Papers, Multiples and Colour variations.

80 **Sudan Postage Dues - 1897-1980.**

John S Gibson (NSW)

Apart from the first issue in 1897, Sudan issued pictorial postage dues showing a British Gunboat with a native sailing boat alongside. These stamps were printed in two colours.

81 **The 1897 Consumptive Homes Charity Issue of N.S.W.**

James Johnstone (NSW)

The exhibit shows the design, issue and use of the two stamps issued by N.S.W. in 1897 as the Consumptive Homes charity set. A number of rare items are highlighted and examples of plate reconstruction are provided to support a web presentation.

82 **The halfpenny 'bantams' of South Australia.**

Harold G Lower (SA)

South Australia's halfpenny 'bantam' is Australia's smallest ever postage stamp. Whilst that might be a source of intrigue for us, it caused extra hassles in its production and use.

83 **HOLEY PROBLEMS, the Harris Scarfe Empire.**

Gordon Monk (SA) One

The story of the perforating machines used by some companies of the Harris Scarfe Empire from 1868 to 1962. The perfins covered are the Adelaide Implement Company, Harris Scarfe and Co. Ltd. and the two perforators H.3 and H.4 made from the HS & Co. machine.

84 **The "Mt Pinatubo Fund" Postal Tax Stamps.**

David Burke (NSW)

In 1992, the Philippines issued Postal Tax Stamps to fund volcanic relief with the stamps being on issue for the purpose for only 78 days. This exhibit shows Tax Stamps and domestic and international covers with Tax stamps affixed.

85 **Three Kookaburras 1914-1937.**

John Kirke (WA)

The first three Kookaburra stamps of King George V era, 1914-1934 showing how circumstances can change a stamp to meet the occasion.

86 **Territory of Papua New Guinea 1964 Health Services Commemorative Issues.**

Paul A Xavier (QLD)

Stamps, printings, constant varieties and use of the issue. A number of new plate varieties are recorded, together with recent research.
