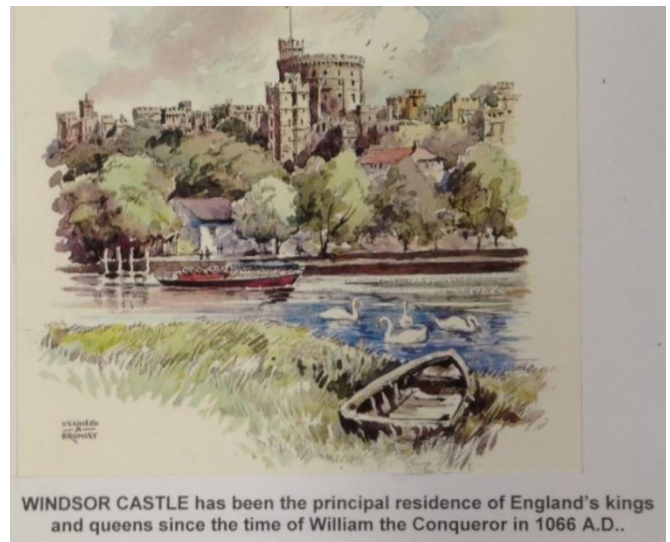

## CLUB COMPETITION

The activity for the day was the annual Club Competition. The competition is divided into three sections - Novice, Intermediate, and Experienced. Experienced entries must be 16 pages. This year the number of entries was down because of the Covid virus, however there were 5 entries, all in the Experienced section. These entries were all judged prior to the meeting by Don Rutherford and Tony Walker so that the results could be announced on the day. They also provided feedback to the entrants. We can expect more entries for the 2021 competition.

- **Ron Davis** (*Castles of Great Britain*) - Large Silver

A nice collection of postcards, photos and stamps with commentary on some of UK's many castles. A very informative display.



- **Greg Laidler** (*The Life and Career of General William Riddell Birdwood*) - Large Vermeil



Birdwood was the British general in charge of ANZAC forces at Gallipoli and later in charge of the Fifth Army that liberated the city of Lille on Oct 17, 1918. Every year on that date, the city flew the British flag as a sign of gratitude. This letter, mailed on Oct 18, 1922, is from the Mayor of Lille to Birdwood advising him of the fact. Note he is addressed as 'Citizen of Lille'. A unique item. There was some hard-to-find material in this interesting display.

- **Carol Davis** (*Ancient Egypt*) - Vermeil

A very colourful collection of covers and postcards all featuring scenes of pyramids, the sphinx or other ancient Egyptian artefacts. Also stamps from a variety of countries with ancient Egyptian scenes.



- **Jim MacDougall** (*Vimy Ridge 1918 - the Battle and its Memorial*) - Vermeil

The decisive, bloody WWI battle in which the Canadian Army captured Vimy Ridge from the Germans, and the breathtaking Memorial built to commemorate the battle. A coming-of-age event for Canada. These French stamps depict the Memorial.



- **Ron Davis** (*Outposts of the French Empire*) - Silver

Part of Ron's inexhaustible collection of small-never-heard-of-countries, these ones are all French colonies. Many of them are in Africa. Some of the stamps shown are attractive French colonial key-plate designs. There are some really pretty stamps here.
