





Lot $3\,$ - scan of page 42, showing the circular cancellers used at the various bases. Other pages show the rectangular stamps that were used.



LOt 4 - half penny green KGV. See descriptions of blocks. Of the single stamps, left stamp is single watermark, and has been hinged twice. The right stamp is large multiple watermark. It has been hinged, and is off centre as shown in scan. On a two strip hagner page.



 ${\sf LOt}\ 5$ - these stamps are CofA watermark, and are entirely mint unhinged. There is a tiny brown mark in the left selvedge, quite prominent on the back but shows through to the front. Arrowed. The selvedge is strong and intact, with no thins.

Stamps are from Pane 7, and were once joined. (Watermark and perfs match up). The block of four, featuring the 'secret mark' variety and the 'weeping pearl' variety (both corrected by John Ash printer), were removed, and I have placed them into the correct location.




The arrowed varieties are 7/4 dash at top right of crown top, and 7/5 bulge in TF right.

Stamps are pane 7, units 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 19, 20, 21.

Located on a hagner page.

LOt 6 - These stamps are mint unhinged. Note the variable centring, common in these issues. Single watermark. The block of 12 stamps has the entire left selvedge attached, the top half has been folded under. On a hagner page.



 $Lot\ 7$ - these stamps are unhinged, although two of them have a minor tone spot. Hinged in top margin, where hinges are shown. Not gummed along top of top selvedge, as was normal, which allowed for the stamps to be held while the gum was being applied. There is one largish tone spot on the back, not really visible from the front, shown with an arrow in the scan. On a hagner page.

 $Lot\ 9$ - irregular block of 9, completely mint unhinged, gum a bit brown but shiny, only faults are the missing corner selvedge at the top right, and thinning at the top left (from where the block was stuck down).
