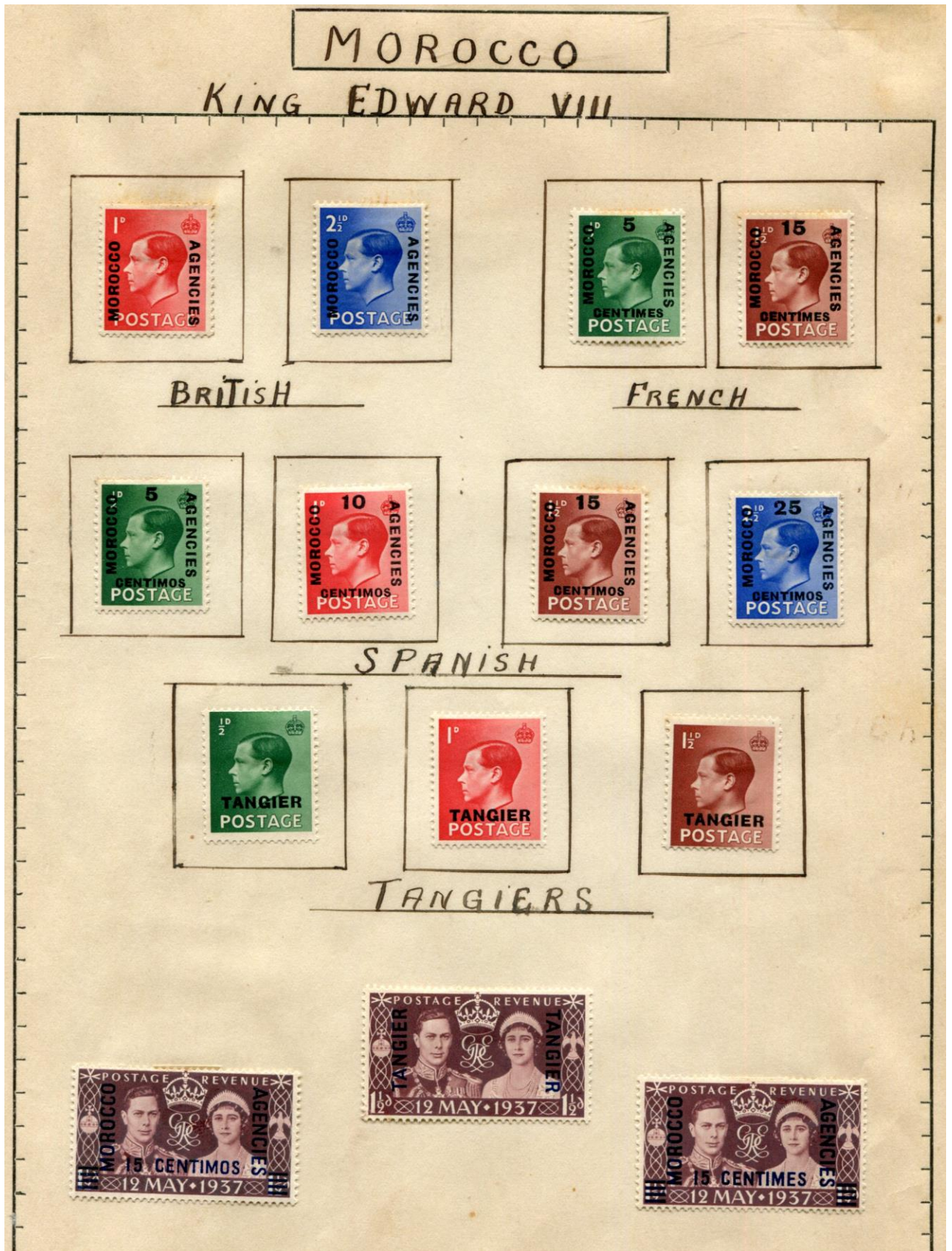

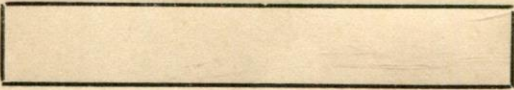

Lot 22 -- fourteen blank album pages, from same source, pages have aged and browned slightly. Also the springback binder, has stain on cover otherwise is OK. One scan for this lot, all pages the same. **Reserve \$1.**

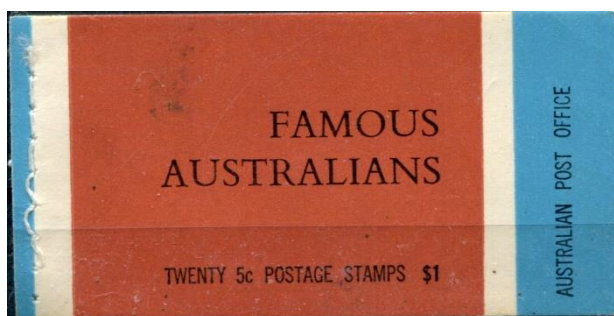


These two lots were left over from Part 1 of the May auction.

Lot 23 - Poster stamp (cinderella) issued for the centenary of Western Australia in 1929. Unhinged but some gum stains on reverse. Front is in good condition. **Reserve \$2.**



Lot 24 - Famous Australians stamp booklet, issued 1968, with five stamps each of Caroline Chisholm, Edgeworth David, Albert Namatjira, and Banjo Paterson, with tab on each pane. Cloth stitching, in overall good condition. **Reserve \$2.**



Lot 25 - a donation from one of our senior members, two Hagner pages of Morocco and Tangiers overprints. Stamps of Morocco, France, England and Gibraltar were overprinted for use in Morocco and Tangiers, at different times, following European intervention. Tangier became an international zone, with French, German and English stamps used at different times. The postal history of Morocco makes a great study. The British overprinted stamps are cheap to buy and make a great collecting area. **Reserve \$15.**
