The stamps portray Private John Simpson and his donkey carrying a wounded soldier. Simpson, a member of the 3rd Australian Field Ambulance, earned the admiration of his comrades for his great courage in rescuing wounded who were unable to walk. He was killed on 19th may 1915.

## AUSTRALIA



The word tekphone is derived from the Greek tele (far) and phoné (sound). One of the pioneer inventors, Alevander Graham Bell patented the first practieal relephone in 1876. In principle similar to present-day instruments his instrument used one opening as trans mitter and reciever
Alexander Graham Bell (1847-1922) was born in Scotland, emigrated to Canada in 1870 and moved to Boston in 1872 He opened a school to train teachers of the deof, and in the same year began experimenting with the Mransmission of sound by electrical means.

The first Australian telephone service, a point to point system, was operned in Melbourne by a private company in 1878. The same year saw the first Australian long-distance conversation between Fort Augusta and Semaphore, Suuth Aust.

The first telephone exchanges in Australia' were opened in 1880 in Brisbane, Sydney and Melbourne only two years after the worlds first.
