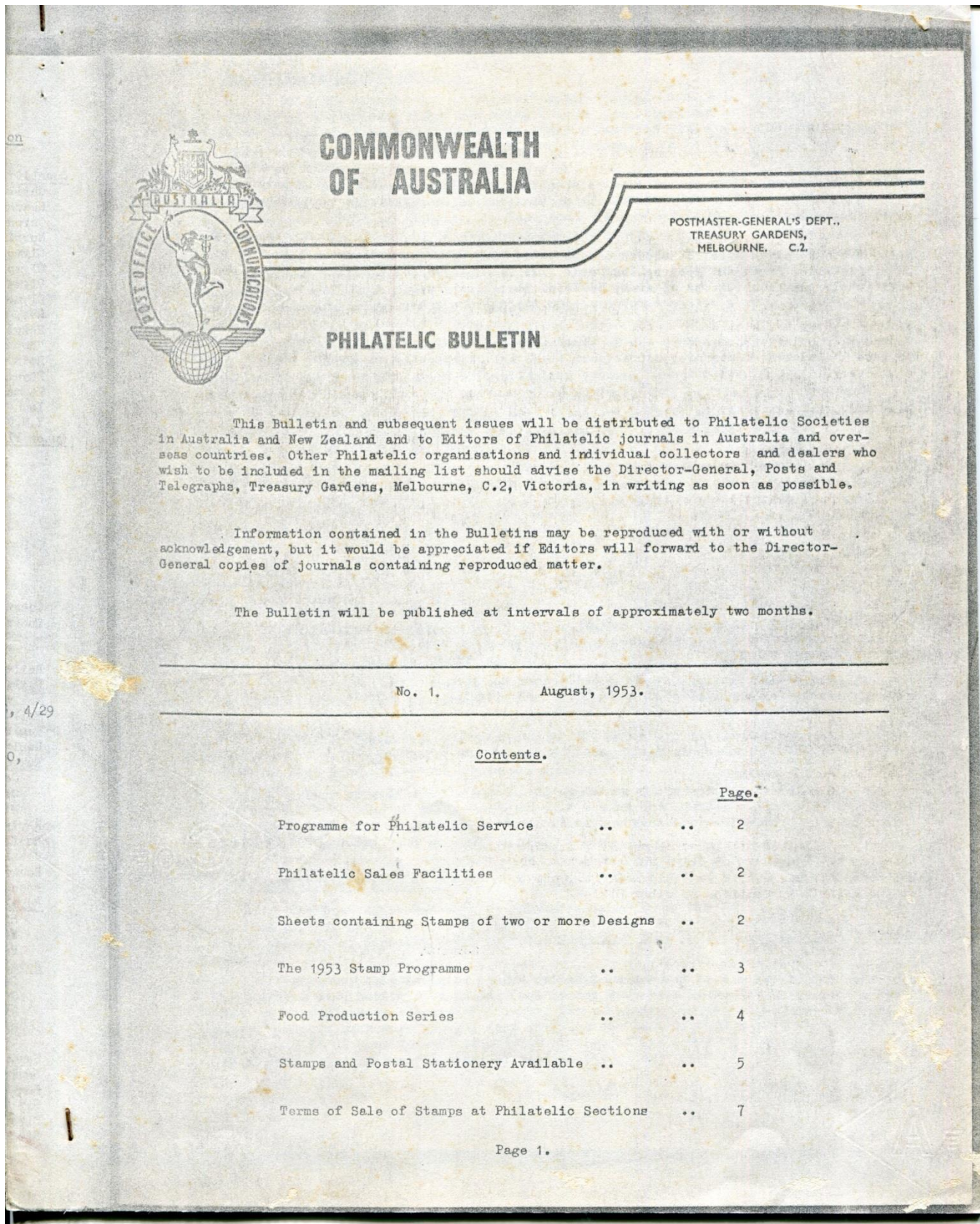

Must be nearly one hundred pages, about 20mm thick bundle of paper. Reserve \$30.

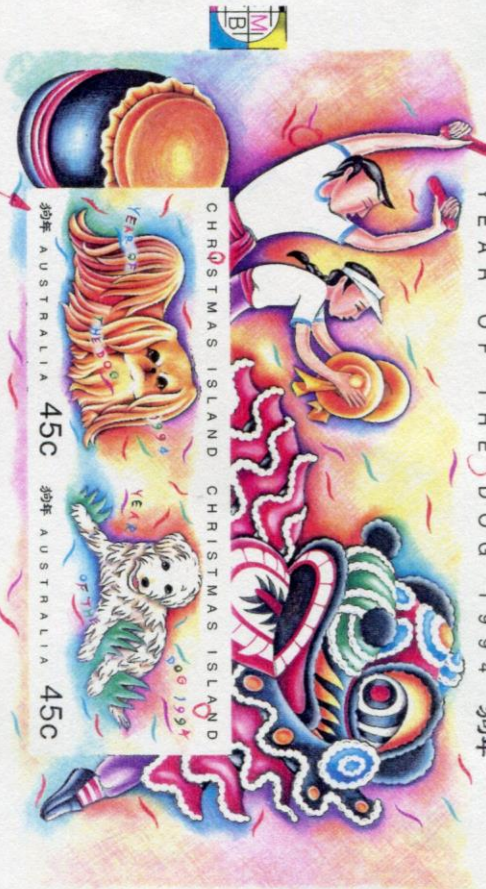






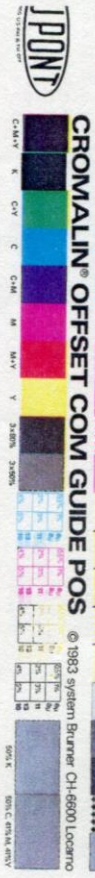
